able to continue to advance the Kingdom in this way. No matter what your line of work was, God can and desires to still use you now.

Also, it is not just ‘work’ information that you can share. Who better to speak into the younger generation about God’s grace and mercy than folks who have lived, walked, and breathed in His goodness for decades? The Bible speaks to this sharing, edifying and building up process often. Our God is the God of many generations, and He encourages us to pass along stories that help explain His goodness. Personal stories are a great way to do that. And it goes without saying that we ALL have a life story. We can share from our victories, as well as our defeats. And sharing personally always makes an impact, rather than just sharing statistics and facts.

And please remember, sharing with someone in a “younger” generation may mean the child next door, or it may mean someone who is just a few years younger than yourself. Remember, from Psalm 145, in which we are encouraged to declare God’s mighty acts, speak of His awesome deeds, and declare His greatness.

Psalm 145: 1-7

- 1 I will exalt you, my God the King;
I will praise your name for ever and ever.*
- 2 Every day I will praise you
and extol your name for ever and ever.*
- 3 Great is the LORD and most worthy of praise;
his greatness no one can fathom.*
- 4 One generation commends your works to another;
they tell of your mighty acts.*
- 5 They speak of the glorious splendor of your majesty—
and I will meditate on your wonderful works.[b]*
- 6 They tell of the power of your awesome works—
and I will proclaim your great deeds.*
- 7 They celebrate your abundant goodness
and joyfully sing of your righteousness.*

The beautiful thing about God is that when we choose to focus on Him and His awesome works, His great deeds, and His abundant goodness, it encourages us to even more joyfully sing of His righteousness. This healthy habit encourages us to get our eyes off ourselves and return our focus to our Savior and our God.

Below are some simple life lessons we have learned and love to share with those who are coming behind us. The younger generations, whether relatives, neighbors, former co-workers, or just acquaintances God places in your path, will value from these and from your own life lessons.

- 1. You'll never regret offering kindness and grace.*

- 3. Practice the art of listening, not just hearing.*
- 4. Begin the habit of saving and tithing early.*
